#### 1<sup>st</sup> Scripture Reading Romans 5:1-5

Therefore, since we are justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have obtained access to this grace in which we stand; and we boast in our hope of sharing the glory of God. And not only that, but we also boast in our sufferings, knowing that suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. But the free gift is not like the trespass. For if the many died through the one man's trespass, much more surely have the grace of God and the free gift in the grace of the one man, Jesus Christ, abounded for the many. For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. If, because of the one man's trespass, death exercised dominion through that one, much more surely will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness exercise dominion in life through the one man, Jesus Christ. But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation. And the free gift is not like the effect of the one man's sin. For the judgment following one trespass brought condemnation, but the free gift following many trespasses brings justification. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. sin was indeed in the world before the law, but sin is not reckoned when there is no law. Yet death exercised dominion from Adam to Moses, even over those whose sins were not like the transgression of Adam, who is a type of the one who was to come. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. Therefore, just as one man's trespass led to condemnation for all, so one man's act of righteousness leads to justification and life for all. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Therefore, just as sin came into the world through one man, and death came through sin, and so death spread to all because all have sinned— For just as by the one man's disobedience the many were made sinners, so by the one man's obedience the many will be made righteous. But law came in, with the result that the trespass multiplied; but where sin increased, grace abounded all the more, so that, just as sin exercised dominion in death, so grace might also exercise dominion through justification leading to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord. For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we will certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. Moses writes concerning the righteousness that comes from the law, that "the person who does these things will live by them." But if our injustice serves to confirm the justice of God, what should we say? That God is unjust to inflict wrath on us? (I speak in a human way.) While we were living in the flesh, our sinful passions, aroused by the law, were at work in our members to bear fruit for death. This is The Word of the Lord. Thanks Be To God.



#### **Gospel Lesson**

John 16:12-15

"I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. All that the Father has is mine. For this reason, I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you. So, you have pain now; but I will see you again, and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you. I came from the Father and have come into the world; again, I am leaving the world and am going to the Father." Very truly, I tell you, you will weep and mourn, but the world will rejoice; you will have pain, but your pain will turn into joy. And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgment: But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, 'Where are you going?' about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; Then some of his disciples said to one another, "What does he mean by saying to us, 'A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me'; and 'Because I am going to the Father'?" But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. Nevertheless I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. They said, "What does he mean by this 'a little while'? We do not know what he is talking about." Jesus knew that they wanted to ask him, so he said to them, "Are you discussing among yourselves what I meant when I said, 'A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me'? about judgment, because the ruler of this world has been condemned. "A little while, and you will no longer see me, and again a little while, and you will see me." On that day you will ask nothing of me. Very truly, I tell you, if you ask anything of the Father in my name, he will give it to you. about sin, because they do not believe in me; Jesus answered them, "Do you now believe? The hour is coming, indeed it has come, when you will be scattered, each one to his home, and you will leave me alone. Yet I am not alone because the Father is with me. They will put you out of the synagogues. Indeed, an hour is coming when those who kill you will think that by doing so they are offering worship to God. And they will do this because they have not known the Father or me. But I have said these things to you so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you about them. "I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. When a woman is in labor, she has pain, because her hour has come. But when her child is born, she no longer remembers the anguish because of the joy of having brought a human being into the world. This is The Word of the Lord. Thanks Be To God.



#### My Hope Is Built on Nothing Less 353


