From our Pastor:

I love opera. As often as I can, I go to the streaming performance the Met offers at movie theaters. My goddaughter Miriam often comes with me. Opera is inspiring. Even the sad ones, even the funny ones, and occasionally, even the not-so-great ones. To be able to put your feelings into words and music is divine. I have an affinity for the classic operas. Puccini is my favorite, but I also love Wagner. And Rossellini, and others, too many to name. I have laughed, and wept, and sat in awe thru many a performance. But there is one that has captured me for most of my adult life: Porgy and Bess. It is a powerful opera.

Porgy and Bess opens with, Clara, a new mom, singing *Summertime* to her infant, as a lullaby. We get the sense that the living really is easy, as the lyrics suggest. Summertime seems to give some breathing space from the busyness of the other seasons. And for kids, summertime is the best time! Of course, since Porgy and Bess is an opera, this feeling of peace does not last.

I am enjoying this summertime. I am not traveling this year, which means I've been able to plant a garden. I have tomatoes and other vegetables. I have herbs. And I have flowers. I have always wanted to grow dahlias. I had visions of planting hundreds, maybe thousands of them! :) I have managed to plant 12. And they are growing! I water them, and talk to them, and watch over them while I sit on my swing in my backyard.

I don't know when they will bloom. I don't know if they will bloom. My job is to make sure they have water, a bit of fertilizer, and a safe place to grow, away from animals who enjoy nibbling on them! And I am doing all those things. I trust they will bloom!

I can't help but think that taking care of my garden is a lot like all of us taking care of the church. Not the building, which of course needs tending too, but the people. We are called to care for each other, not only those who worship here, but those in the community around us. I wonder how we put that care in to action! To watch over, to provide a safe space, to give nourishment, both physical and spiritual, is our call!

In this season, may God direct us in care for those around us.

PNC Report: The PNC is asking for the prayers of the congregation to help us in our search.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Finance & Stewardship: Scovill reported that the third stewardship letter should be going out soon.

Spiritual Life: Darren Woodke reported that an event for Sunday, July 24th with outdoor worship under a tent is in the planning process.

Personnel: Parker reported that the job descriptions for the paid staff have been amended and approved by the various involved committees. The "Personnel Policies Handbook" has been amended with minor changes to the policies. Motion sustained to approve the changes.





SUMMER HAPPENINGS AT CTC

CHRISTMAS IN JULY: You are invited to celebrate Christmas in July! We will be collecting "gifts" for the Rescue Mission Impact Designs which helps furnish rooms and homes for those moving out of emergency shelters. These are some suggested items:



- Cooking pot sets
- New bed pillows
- 13 -gallon kitchen trash (waste) baskets
- Brooms and Swiffers
- Full and Twin mattress and box spring sets (Don't bring to church)

There will be a Christmas tree at the front of the sanctuary where you can place your gifts. No need to wrap them.

Look for a Christmas box on the table at the back of the sanctuary for donations if you prefer to have us shop for you. You can mail a check to church. Please make a note on the check that the donation is for Christmas in July.

<u>July Mission of the Month:</u> The mission of the month for July is Emmaus Homes. There are 13 homes which can serve 47 women who are coming from jail, prison, or rehab. The average stay is 8 months and their longest was 6 years. Emmaus is entirely supported by donations. They also have the Morrow Center which is a free thrift center. They will pick up gently used items – clothes, shoes, coats, housewares, books, toys, linens, furniture, appliances. Call 989-755-7538. Volunteers are always needed for yardwork, office, transportation. **Mark your check or donations Emmaus**.

<u>August Mission of the Month</u>: The Mission of the month for August will be Weiss School. Money is needed for food items for the backpacks which children with food scarcity take home on weekends. The food is purchased at the Food Bank of Eastern Michigan. Lists of school supplies needed will be available on the table in Fellowship Hall in August. Boxes to put the items in will be Fellowship Hall. **As usual mark check donation for Weiss School**.



These Days: These Days magazines are on the entryway table in Fellowship Hall if you would like to pick one up. A donation jar is on the table.






<u>Greeting Cards</u>: A variety of greeting cards are on the table inside the East entrance to the building. Please leave your payment in the basket provided.
