Did you know that March is the only month that gives a command? March fourth! I think it is appropriate that March is the month that gives us a command. March is kind of a transitional month. The weather warms us a bit, but we still get snow. The days are still short, but they are getting longer. We dream of spring, but it is still too soon to plant. But we are to March 4th!

To march fourth is an act of courage. On March 7, 1965, John Lewis lead a peaceful march for civil rights across the Edmund Pettus bridge in Alabama. It was a peaceful protest march. Or it was supposed to be. Those who were marching 4th were met by state troopers who attacked them, beat them with their clubs, sprayed tear gas on them, and blocked their way. But this violence was different from the violence previously experienced by those who were working for civil rights. This violence was captured on film. And for the first time, America saw the brutality that was routinely inflected on peaceful protesters. And in response, many thousands joined the cause. As a result of Bloody Sunday, voting rights acts were passed.

Of course, that is not the end of the story. These stories never have that "happily ever after" ending we long for. The fight for equality still rages on. We have become all too aware of the need for equality in race, gender, age, social standing issues. And we are called to march fourth! The way we march is different now. But we are called, not by the command in March, but by the command of Jesus to work for justice. For Jesus told us we are to love others as we love ourselves. And that means working for the dignity of each person. To ensure that all people have equal rights.

I am longing for Spring. And we get glimpses of it in March. Spring brings new life. We can bring new life too, as we march fourth for love.




PER CAPITA FOR 2023

As church members we are reminded annually that we must pay a per capita tax to our denomination. This money usually goes toward paying expenses at the higher level than our own immediate church. Since we are a two denomination church (Presbyterian and United Church of Christ), we receive two bills for per capita. The denominations base the total per capita on the number of members that the church reports. Also, please bear in mind that since we are two denominations, all of our membership statistics that are submitted to the two denominations annually are divided in half. For instance, if we have 100 members, the report to each denomination will be 50 members. The Presbytery bill for us covers 50 members, so it is actually to our benefit. We also receive a bill for a lesser amount from UCC based on 50 members.

With this in mind, the Session has approved a request to be made to the members to pay \$30.00 for the per capita for 2023. Just a gentle reminder that the per capita is per member, not per household. So if you have four people in your household that are members of Countryside Church, you are asked to pay for all four people a total of \$120.00. In order to defray the expense of the per capita, the Session is asking that members assist the church by paying their own per capita of \$30.00/member for 2023. We do not want to put a hardship on anyone but these bills must be paid whether our treasury gets help from the members or not. There will be an envelope marked "per capita" in your box of contribution envelopes that you will be receiving in the next few weeks that you can use.

The Session appreciates your help in this matter.






DATE TO BE DETERMINED

THESE DAYS: These Days magazines are on the table in Fellowship Hall if you would like to pick one up. A donation jar is on the table.



I know it doesn't necessarily look like summer is coming when you look out the window but trust me – it **is** coming!


