I love to sing! I sing a lot! I sing "oldies", I sing opera, I sing hymns, and sometimes I make up songs! I don't have a great voice. You don't have a great voice in order to sing! Singing is about the song, not about the quality of voice. Sometimes it seems that the only appropriate response is to sing!

And plants can be moved and/or planted outside towards the end of the month. Mother's Day is in May. Pentecost is in May! Surely singing is a proper response!

An article came across my desk this week entitled: 9 Reasons Every Church needs to Sing Hymns. I'm not going to give you all 9 reasons. I'll be a good Presbyterian and pick only three.

So, the first reason every church needs to sing Hymns is: They tell **The story.** I remember being young and in Sunday School. We had gathering time and all the elementary grades sang together before going to our classes. Singing hymns spoke to me in such a way, that I just knew I was hearing Jesus.

The second reason Congregations need to sing hymns: They allow for more authentic response of emotional expression. I sing because I'm Happy! Precious Lord, Take my Hand, I sing when I feel lost. I sing, because God gave me music. And sometimes there is no other way to pray.

And the third reason. Hymns were written for congregational singing. This is so cool. Did you know that when we sing hymns we breathe together? We automatically take a breath at the end of the sentence! Together.

The beating of our hearts is the first rhythm we hear - from the moment God knits us together in the womb. And so heartbeat and breath - when we sing together we are one body. And we know whose body we are.

Breathe in - and let it go. Together, one body in Christ. Hear it. Feel it. Sing it. It is well with my soul! Grace and truth, Pastor Jane

END CHILD MARRIAGE IN MICHIGAN POSTCARD PARTY

Sunday May 21, 2023

Please join me immediately after church Sunday May 21, 2023, in fellowship hall to see a quick video and put together postcards to our state legislators to end child marriage in Michigan.

Around the world, 12 million girls marry before the age of 18 each year and it happens right here in Michigan. 5,426 children were married in Michigan between 2000 and 2021, some as young as 14. Without a voice and isolation from peers and society, child marriage puts girls at risk of violence throughout their lives. Minors have limited rights. This makes escape or divorce difficult if not impossible. A girl's body is not ready for childbirth before the age of 18 which increases the risk of pregnancy complications.

The statistics are clear that early child marriage is a human rights violation. Devastating consequences of marrying before the age of 18 years old include:

- Drop out of school 50% chance of dropping out of high school
- Cycle of poverty 31% more likely to live in poverty
- Economic dependence 3 times more likely to have at least 5 children compared to women who marry in adulthood
- Health 23% greater risk for serious health conditions such as heart attack, diabetes, cancer and stroke
- Mental health 3 times more likely to develop antisocial personality disorder and major depressive disorder
- Domestic violence 3 times more likely to be beaten by their spouse

Michigan legislation has introduced House bills 4293-4302 and Senate bills 209-217 & 246 that will keep the marriage age at 18 and eliminate the loopholes that allow marriage before that age. The Michigan Coalition to End Child Marriage and Zonta Clubs are hosting postcard parties to encourage House Judiciary and Senate Civil Rights, Judiciary and Public Safety Committee members and local representatives and senators to pass the bills. I am a member of both. The more voices, the better the chance of getting the attention of our representatives and senators and legislation passed.

Bring your favorite pens and address labels. I will supply the postcards, state representative and senator address labels and stamps.
