PER CAPITA DONATIONS

As church members we are reminded annually that we must pay a per capita tax to our denomination. This money usually goes toward paying expenses at the higher level than our own immediate church. Since we are a two-denomination church (Presbyterian and United Church of Christ), we receive two bills for per capita. The denominations base the total per capita on the number of members that the church reports. Also, please bear in mind that since we are two denominations, all of our membership statistics that are submitted to the two denominations annually are divided in half. For instance, if we have 100 members, the report to each denomination will be 50 members. The Presbytery bill for us covers 50 members, so it is actually to our benefit. We also receive a bill for a lesser amount from UCC based on 50 members.

With this in mind, the Session has approved a request to be made to the members to pay \$30.00 per capita for 20024. Just a gentle reminder that the per capita is per member, not per household. So, if you have four people in your household that are members of Countryside Church, you are asked to pay for all four people a total of \$120.00. In order to defray the expense of the per capita, the Session is asking that members assist the church by paying their own per capita of \$30.00/member for 20024. We do not want to put a hardship on anyone, but these bills must be paid whether our treasury gets help from the members or not. There will be an envelope marked "per capita" in your box of contribution envelopes that you will be receiving in the next few weeks that you can use.

The Session appreciates your help in this matter.

On Friday, April 19, 253 Special Olympics Athletes gathered at Saginaw Valley State University's Ryder Center to take part in Track and Field and Swimming competitions. Athletes ages 8-62 from Saginaw County and Bay County were assisted by over 750 volunteers and teaching staff.

From our own Countryside Trinity Church members Ron Platt and Lou Diechman' Optimist Club provided the chips for our lunch. Ron helped oversee the packing of lunches for the 1000 attendees. This is the 44th year the Optimist Club has helped with lunches for Area 22 Special Olympics.

Roger Scovill and John Van Arsdale safely oversaw busing drop off and pick up of athletes and their teaching staff. Roger picked up McDonald hamburgers for our meal. CTC member, Aaron Plater from Saginaw Medical has provided lifts to help with student needs during the day for over 30 years. I help coordinate the schools and athletes and work with SVSU students in the Cardinal's for Special Olympics student organization. With great help, the Games come together for an exciting day for our athletes and their families!

Special Olympics provides a year-round sports program for persons 8 and older with an intellectual disability or delay. We are a non-profit so there is no cost to our athletes or their families to participate. We rely on fund raisers and donations, like the rummage sale and hotdog sale at this year's Walleye Festival. The golf fundraiser on June 1 is also a fund raiser for Special Olympics if you are a golfer or would like to be a sponsor. If asked to donate or if you give a memorial gift for Special Olympics, please know that your money will only help local athletes if your check is made out to **Area 22 Special Olympics**. Area 22 includes all of Saginaw and Shiawassee Counties. Money given to Special Olympics goes directly to the State Special Olympics office and not to our local area.
